# Student Satisfaction Survey 

## A.Y.2019-20 <br> Report

Objective: The Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted to capture the perception of the students regarding the teaching-learning and evaluation process in Smt.CHM College.

The Sample: The Survey was carried out among the present batch of the final year students of all the Under-Graduate Programmes (UG) who were enrolled in the First Year Class in the Academic Year 2019-20. The questionnaire suggested in the NAAC Mannual was prepared and circulated through email. Email were sent to 1591 respnodents, 739 responses were received. 223 respondents reported Male gender and 481 respondents reported female gender. One respondent reported the Others category.

The table given below shows the Programme and Gender wise distribution of the respondents.

Analysis: The mean score of each of the twenty close-ended objective types of questions was calculated and an overall mean was arrived at. The open-ended question was analysed by aggregating the most frequent responses.
