

A REPORT ON

**Certificate Course on
"Approaching Nationalism in Constitutional Framework:
A Course in Applied General Semantics"**

Instead of transforming the world as global village, the neoliberal globalization of 21st Century turned the nationalities into the villages wrapped in their ethnic identities. The upsurge of nationalistic sentiments is both the cause and the consequence of deeply rooted insecurities that were suppressed under the constitutional promises of justice and independence in Post-War world. In India, in past few years we witnessed the rise of radical nationalism on ethnic and communal ground that throws open the challenge before the rationally inclined minds to interpret and carry the society to the logical end of modernity that is to construct the sensible world. There is a renewed and intensive debate over the strands of nationalism in India. The highly charged political mood of the surrounding brought the youth of the country at the crossroads of life where rational attitude is highly needed than the early years of political independence.

At this backdrop the Certificate Course on "Approaching Nationalism in Constitutional Framework: A Course in Applied General Semantics" conducted to explore and understand the phenomena with tools of General Semantics. It aimed at proposing academic intervention and nurturing of human resource to engage the complex world of our imagination in terms of nationalism and constitution in India. The Course was conducted in a single phase between 13th March, 2019 and 27th March, 2019. The total duration of the course was 30 hours. A total of 30 students, with a background of political science, participated and successfully completed the course. The copy of syllabus and schedule was provided to them in the beginning of the course. Further, a compiled study material was also provided containing extracts of writings on nationalism by Mahatma Gandhi, Ravindranath Togore, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar and Romila Thapar. The course was highly relevant to the current debate over nationalism and constitutional values. It helped inculcate the rational approach embodied in the Constitution of India to overcome the individual crisis. It also offered the perspective to look at the trajectory of nationalism in India from the General Semantics Approach and locate the discourse in the constitutional framework.

The Course opened with sessions engaged by Dr. Karmarkar on 13th and 14th March, 2019. These sessions focused on fundamental tenets of General Semantics. These tenets were discussed with reference to the post-Pulwama crisis of nationalism. On 15th March, Dr. Tambe

took lectures on the concept nationalism. He talked about the meaning and types of nationalism. On 16th March, he engaged sessions on the history of nationalism. He discussed how the evolution of nationalism can be understood in time-binding perspective; how the concept and movements of nationalism adapted to the challenges of the time. He discussed ideas of Dr. Ambedkar in particular and also that of Romila Thapar. Dr. Kelkar conducted two days sessions on 18th and 19th March. He talked about the meaning and philosophy of Indian Constitution, in the context of which the contemporary narrative of nationalism needs to be examined. On 22nd March, Dr. Namita Nimbalkar, Associate Professor of Philosophy, University of Mumbai, engaged sessions on the ideas of Gandhi and Tagore on nationalism and its role in shaping the character of Indian Nationalism. Dr. Harshad Bhosale, Assistant Professor of Political Science, D. G. Ruparel College, Matunga, Mumbai, on 23rd March, elaborately discussed on the issues and problems of nationalism with numerous contemporary examples of Indian Nationalism. After exposing students to the fundamentals of General Semantics, Nationalism and Indian Constitution, they were ready to connect these three at the backdrop of current events in the country. The sessions engaged by Dr. Tambe and Dr. Karmarkar between 25th March and 27th March were mainly focused on linking General Semantics, Nationalism and Indian Constitution, and understand the connections and gaps among them. On 25th March, Dr. Tambe discussed the ongoing debates on constitution and nationalism. On 26th March, Dr. Karmarkar discussed how the constitution has been interpreted and miss-interpreted by people and groups to fit-in their version of nationalism in it. He, then, discussed how General Semantics can be used to understand these debates and interpretations. Students realized how differentiating assumptions from facts in different versions of nationalism is significant. They also learnt how delayed reaction and use of extensional devices help us better understand what is being spoken and written in the public domain. It has a potential to save oneself from being carried away towards absolutist and fundamentalist ideas that lead to insane behaviours. 27th March, the last day of the Course, was basically the day of feedbacks. Dr. Karmarkar and Dr. Tambe initiated group discussions. The questions were raised on whether General Semantics can be applied to insane group nationalism; how an individual learning can be translated into group learning, etc. This brought forth the need to draft a memorandum on nationalism, constitution and general semantics by mentioning clearly what needs to be done at individual and public level to establish sanity in thoughts and actions. Initiated by Dr. Tambe, the students of the Course did a brainstorming discussion on the draft of the Memorandum. They prepared the first draft during the sessions. The work of properly wording and framing this Memorandum, so as to declare it in the public domain, is still on. This Memorandum is the contribution of the Course Students the efforts of nation-building in India.


