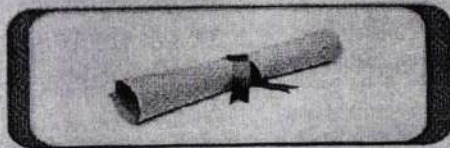

NODAL CENTER FOR GENERAL SEMANTICS (2016-2017)

A REPORT

Nodal Centre for General Semantics completed three years in the academic year 2016-2017. This year has proved to be an important year for the Nodal Centre. We heartily congratulate Dr. Deepa Mishra for receiving prestigious Hayakawa Book Prize for her book 'General Semantics: A Critical Companion', (Pencraft International, New Delhi) awarded by the Institute of General Semantics, New York, USA.

Nodal Centre has been conducting certificate courses since, last two years, with an objective of spreading awareness of General Semantics Approach. This year, a new syllabus for certificate course was introduced entitled "Sensible Thinking for the Complex World: A General Semantics Perspective". A total of 13 students (11 first and second year students, 01 post-graduate alumnus, and 01 faculty member – all belonging to Arts Faculty) successfully completed the Course. A compiled study material was provided to the students. It primarily contained extracts from the book *Drive Yourself Sane: Using the Uncommon Sense of General Semantics* by Susan Kodish and Bruce Kodish. It also contained a few extracts from the website of the Institute of General Semantics, USA, from the blog of Milton Dawes, and also from the book *Here's Something About General Semantics: A Primer for Making Sense of Your World* by Steve Stockdale. Along with this study material, a separate document *General Semantics: An Outline Survey* by Kenneth G. Johnson was also provided.

The first phase was held from July 25, 2016 to August 11, 2016 (34 clock hours). It covered Module I (Basic Principles of General Semantics) and Module II (Awareness, Language and Thinking). The topics covered, and the concerned faculty in the first phase are – Korzybski's Quest, 'Two Worlds' and the Problem of Language, How to Agree-Disagree, Socratic Questioning, Structure of Language, Aristotelian and Non-Aristotelian System (Dr Deepa Mishra), Significance of Scientific Attitude, Verbal Awareness, Non-Identity, Non-Elementalism, Non-Allness (Dr Samuel Wesley), Brain and Nervous System (Prof Jayshree Panicker), Process of Abstraction, E-Prime, Extensional Devices (Prof Hitasha Rohra), Map-Territory Relationship, Consciousness of Mapping, Time-Binding, How to Differ, Being Critical (Dr Dipesh Karmarkar), Non-Verbal Awareness (jointly by Dr Deepa Mishra & Dr Dipesh Karmarkar), Internal and External Orientation (Prof Bhavna Binwani), Structural Differential: A Tool for Sanity, and Language, Response, and Responsibility (Dr Bini B S).

The second phase was held from January 5, 2017 to January 21, 2017 (27 clock hours). The second phase covered Module III (Applications of General Semantics). The topics covered and the concerned faculty in the second phase include – History and General Semantics (Dr Samuel Wesley), Films and General Semantics (Dr Ananya Ghoshal), Relativity and Quantum Theory



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from a Korzybskian Frame of Reference (Prof Prakash Gajare), Newtonian Thinking and General Semantics (Dr Vivek Kale), General Semantics and Visual Arts, A-R-T Thinking as a Process of Creation of Art (Mr Mahendra Damle), General Semantics and Mathematics (Dr Sangeeta Joshi), Education and General Semantics (Dr Manju Lalwani Pathak), Psychology and General Semantics: REBT, General Semantics and Daily Life Applications (Prof Jayshree Panicker), Political Identity and General Semantics (Dr Chandrasheel Tambe), and What Did Korzybski Want (Dr Dipesh Karmarkar).

The Valedictory Function of the Certificate Course was organised on February 25, 2017. Prof. Prafulla C. Kar, Director, Balvant Parekh Centre, was the Chief Guest and Speaker for the function. In his valedictory address, Prof. Kar spoke on the relevance of General Semantics approach to our lives. He emphasized the need for improving time-binding and conscious use of language.

The members of the Nodal Centre conducted workshop and delivered lectures on General Semantics. On August 10, 2016, Dr Deepa Mishra delivered lectures on General Semantics in R. N. Jhunjhunwala College, Ghatkopar, Mumbai. On September 17, 2016, the English Literary Association of G M Momin's Women's College organised a One-Day Workshop on 'Introduction to General Semantics'. Dr Deepa Mishra and Dr Dipesh Karmarkar were the resource persons for the workshop. The workshop was well received by about 100 students.

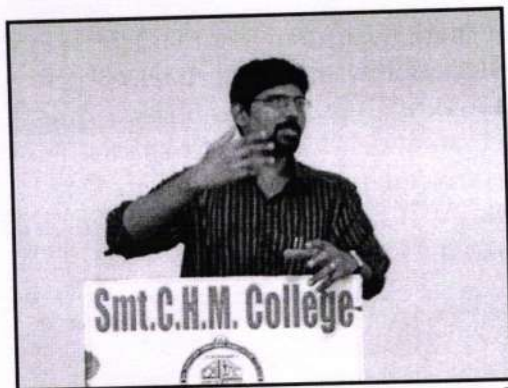

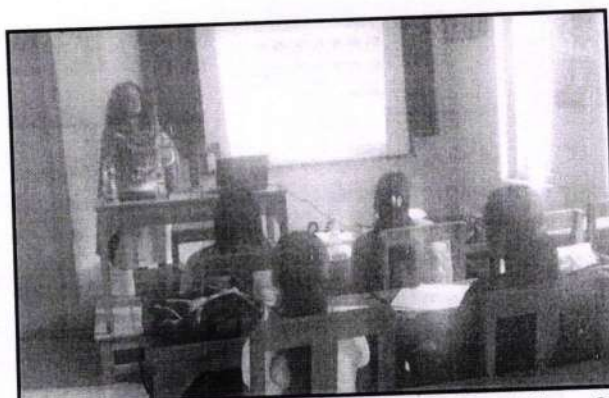

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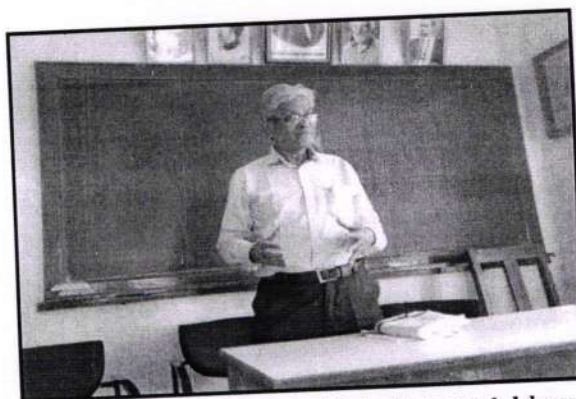

A Certificate Course on

Sensible Thinking for the Complex World: A General Semantics Approach

• **Rationale:**

Since the fall of the Babari Masjid, at the end of the 20th century, the world around us started falling apart. On one side, there was an onset of globalisation, which was projected as an integrating process, but on the other side, one could observe the disintegrating world materialised through extreme terrorism, communal violence, gender atrocities, etc. Recent attacks on the lives of forward thinkers and social workers like Mr. Narendra Dabholkar and Mr. Govind Pansare brought a colossal loss of rationality and humanity. At present, people all over the world are engaged in fighting violent battles with each other. Race, religion, caste, class, creed, gender, etc. all are turning out to be the limiting factors for the man's overall progress. In such a situation, it becomes very difficult to evaluate oneself as well as the disintegrating world. How to live a sane life in the world full of insanity is a very significant problem of the present generation.

Thus, the world of Korzybski, in the first half of the 20th century (when he developed the system of General Semantics at the backdrop of the World War I), has not changed much even in the second decade of the 21st century. One cannot see very impressive signs that the humanity has entered in its 'manhood' as Korzybski felt; instead, in the words of Homer J. Moore, one can say that "we have entered the 'Teen-hood of Humanity' at best". And then, the need of Korzybski's thoughts was never been greater. At this backdrop, it becomes necessary to learn how to think sensibly in this ever-changing complex world and how to have more conscious expression, verbal and non-verbal.

• **Objectives:**

At this backdrop, the Nodal Centre for General Semantics in the Smt. C. H. M. College along with a solid support from its parent body, Balvant Parekh Centre for General Semantics and Other Human Sciences, Baroda, is proposing a Certificate Course titled "'Sensible Thinking' for the Complex World: A General Semantics Approach". The present course will enable students to think and act sensibly, 'preparing them for life'. While understanding the fundamentals of the General Semantics system, students will also learn how General Semantics can be applied as an approach to address issues in the disciplines of natural and social sciences as well as visual arts. Students will also learn to apply this approach in their personal and daily life situations. In all, the learners of this course will learn the method to understand the complex world around them, while understanding to evaluate themselves.

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- **Duration:**

The total duration of the course will be **60 clock hours**. The entire course will be conducted in **three phases**, giving ample scope and opportunity for the learners to explore General Semantics through various activities like presentations, assignments, focused readings, etc.

- **Eligibility and Registration:**

All graduate and postgraduate students of all disciplines and faculties are eligible to take up this course. There are no preconditions other than mutual respect and honest engagement on the subject and regular attendance. Registration can be done by giving an application in the prescribed form along with the registration fees of Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five Hundred Only) which is non-refundable. Study material will be provided. Snacks will be provided to the students.

- **Faculty:**

The course will be taught by the expert in-house and guest faculty.

- **Assessment:**

Students will be examined through inclusive and self-study methods such as group discussions, presentations, class assignments, etc. Minimum 75% attendance and 90% submissions of the work assigned is mandatory for the students to become eligible for getting the certificates. There is no grading system. Certificates of successful completion of the course will be awarded at the end of the course.


