

A Certificate Course on

Key Concepts in General Semantics

- **Course Rationale:**

Our thoughts and the way we think and handle our emotions play a significant role in our life. It is our thinking that decides whether our actions are constructive or destructive; whether we are efficient or inefficient, productive or unproductive, sensible or foolish. So, learning and adopting better ways of thinking is a fundamental requirement for personal as well as professional development of an individual. The approach of General Semantics offers an uncommon tool to improve the process of our thinking and to channelize it towards constructive behaviour. For this purpose, the Nodal Centre for General Semantics is offering a Short Certificate Course on "Key Concepts in General Semantics".

- **Course Objectives:**

This course introduces the participants to the key concepts in General Semantics. The course aims at learning the fundamentals of the General-Semantics Approach and to enable young students to think and act sensibly by applying the General-Semantics Approach to the everyday life.

- **Learning Outcomes:**

At the end of the Course, students should be able to –

- Bind time effectively
- Use language more consciously
- Apply scientific attitude
- To address issues of everyday life sensibly

- **Duration:**

The total duration of the course will be 30 clock hours. 23 clock hours will be devoted for lectures, while 07 hours are devoted for students' assignments, group discussion, reading, etc. The entire course will be conducted in a single phase of maximum 15 days.

- **Eligibility and Registration:**

All graduate and postgraduate students (17 to 22 years) of all disciplines and faculties are eligible to take up this course. There are no preconditions other than openness of mind, mutual respect, honest engagement on the subject, and regular attendance. Registration can be done by giving an application in the prescribed form along with the registration fees of Rs. 300/- (Rupees Three Hundred Only) which is non-refundable. Study material will be provided.

- **Faculty:**

The course will be taught by the expert in-house faculty.

- **Assessment:**

Students will be examined through internal and self-study methods such as PPT, assignments and readings. Minimum 80% attendance, and 90% submissions of the work assigned is mandatory for the students to become eligible for getting the certificates. There is no grading system. Certificates of successful completion of the course will be awarded at the end of the course.

ANNUAL REPORT

Nodal Centre for General Semantics (NCGS) has completed seven years in the academic year 2019-2020. In the current year, the Nodal Centre offered a certificate course on 'Key Concepts in General Semantics'. The objective of the course was to introduce the key concepts in General Semantics to the under-graduate students. The course also aimed at enabling students to think and act sensibly by applying the General-Semantics approach to the everyday life. A total of 16 students, primarily from Arts Faculty, registered for the course. The course was conducted between February 10, 2020 and February 24, 2020. The duration of course was 30 hours, out of which 20 hours were devoted to teaching sessions, while 10 hours were kept side for activity-based self-learning. A compiled study material was provided to them containing extracts from the book *Drive Yourself Sane: Using the Uncommon Sense of General Semantics* by Susan Kodish and Bruce Kodish. It also contained a few extracts from the website of the Institute of General Semantics, USA, from the blog of Milton Dawes, and also from the book *Here's Something About General Semantics: A Primer for Making Sense of Your World* by Steve Stockdale.

The units covered in the 20 hours of teaching sessions (and the concerned speakers) included Introduction to General Semantics with reference to introduction to Korzybski and distinction between sanity and insanity, Map-Territory Relationship, Consciousness of Mapping (Dr. Dipesh Karmarkar, Coordinator of the NCGS and In-house Faculty, Department of Geography), Process of Abstraction (Ms. Sitara Menon, In-house Faculty, Department of Psychology), Structural Differential (Dr. Hitasha Rohra, In-house Faculty, Department of Banking & Insurance), Time-Binding and Extensional Devices (Dr. Samuel Wesley, In-house Faculty, Department of History), Verbal and Non-Verbal Awareness and Structure of Language (Dr. Deepa Mishra, In-house Faculty, Department of English), and REBT and General Semantics (Dr. Jayashree Panicker, In-house Faculty, Department of Psychology).

The conceptual understanding of the students was qualitatively tested with the help of home assignments and class activities. Students were asked to think and write assignments based on time-binding, process of abstraction, non-verbal sensory experience, conceptual and evaluational skills and application-based skills. They were also given role-play based activities, making them delve deeper into the conceptual understanding and its everyday applications. Ms. Sitara Menon, Dr. Chandrasheel Tambe (In-house Faculty, Department of Political Science) and Dr. Dipesh Karmarkar helped and guided the students (as and when required by the students) in completion of these activities. Certificates were distributed at the hands of Dr. Jayashree Panicker in the last session.




The feedback analysis shows that about 90% of the students were completely satisfied with the format of the course. About 80% of the students expressed their complete satisfaction with the content of the course. Further, 90% students felt that the course was interactive enough for them. Students' responses to open-ended questions show that they have made a serious and sincere attempt to apply GS principles to the ongoing issues in their personal lives. Most of the students reveal that they learnt to avoid extreme thinking, impulsive reactions, stereotyping, controlling anger, etc. Further, many of them have suggested to include sessions on E-Prime, and critical analysis of the GS. They were found to be happy with the activity-based learning, but also expect more such activities to be included in future courses.






**Ms. Sitara Menon during the Session on

'Structural Differential'**




**Dr. Chandrasheel Tambe Guiding Students on

Identity**








